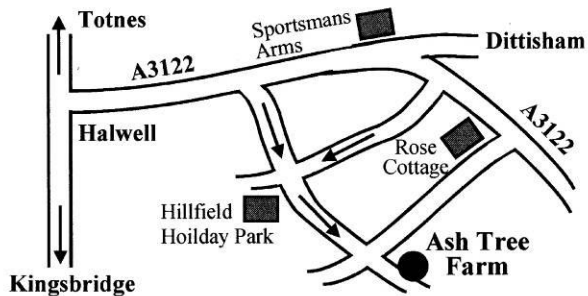

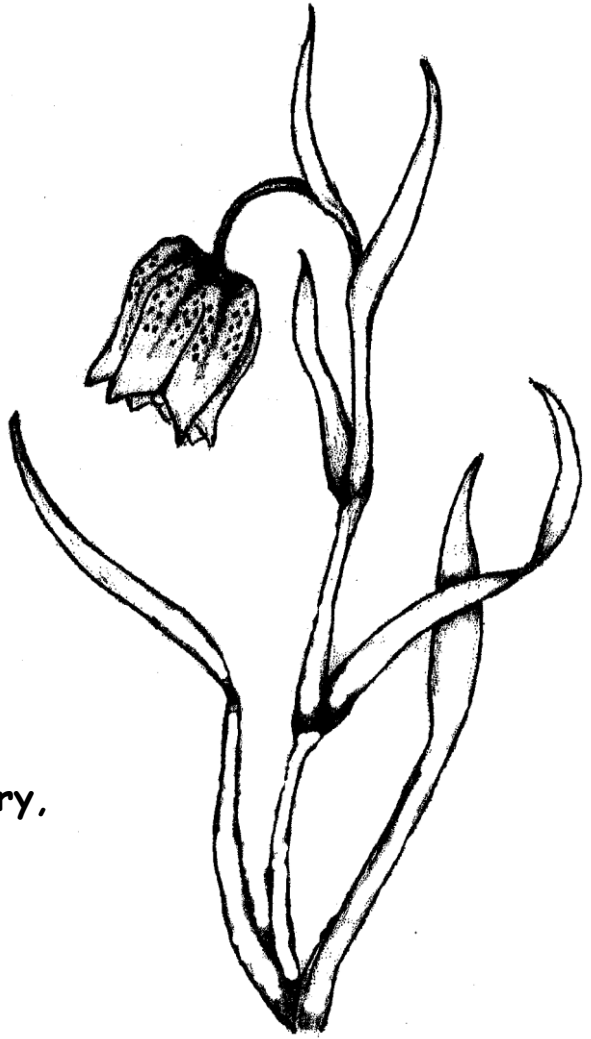

*Wild about Flowers* is owned by Pam Gregson and is based at Ash Tree Farm Nursery near Dartmouth. Stevie and Jenny Rogers, owners of the nursery, grow coastal and drought tolerant plants, unusual vegetable plants and an increasing range of plants beneficial to wildlife.

*Wild about Flowers* is a *Specialist Wild Flower Nursery* growing a wide range of wild flowers suitable for garden use, many of which may be fairly rare in the wild but will quite happily grow in gardens given the right conditions. Many are very adaptable and we are constantly surprised to find plants thriving in conditions which are very different to their native habitat! Most wildflowers are also important for wildlife, providing nectar for insects, butterflies and moths, seeds for birds and acting as food plants for the larvae of native butterflies and moths. The eggs of each species are laid on specific plants, so providing these plants is very important for their continued existence.

Also available are plants for woodland and meadows, pond and marginal plants and native trees, shrubs and hedging. Seeds can be supplied as mixes for specialised areas, or in single species. We are also growing plugs and plants in 7cm pots which are particularly useful for large scale planting and for landscapers.

The nursery is open on Sundays only (10am-4pm) until February 2009 and thereafter on Sundays and Wednesdays 9.30-5pm. Other days are possible by arrangement - please phone first.

We can deliver plants if required. Mail order is available through the website, or by phone. Please do not hesitate to ring or email if you have any queries.

## Plants for sunny sites

**Agrimony**- *Agrimonia eupatoria*. Spikes of yellow flowers, 30-60cm. Good for well drained meadow or border. Seeds for birds.

**Birds foot Trefoil** - *Lotus corniculatus*. Yellow pea flowers, 15-30cm. Important food plant for butterflies and moths including Common Blue, Clouded Yellow and Wood White.

**Biting Stonecrop**. *Sedum acre*. Low growing, creeping evergreen, bright yellow flowers May-July. Food plant for several moths. Likes dry, poor soil.

**Bladder Campion** - *Silene vulgaris*. White flowers with large bulbous calyx. 30-40cm. Important moth food plant.

**Bloody Cranesbill** - *Geranium sanguineum*. Well drained neutral/alkaline soil. 20-30cm. Magenta flowers in summer.

**Cheddar Pink**. *Dianthus gratianopolitanus*. Fragrant clove pink, now only found in Cheddar Gorge but more common in Europe. Grown from European seed and therefore suitable for garden use but not to be planted in wild areas.

**Chicory** - *Cichorium intybus*. Up to 1m. Sky blue flowers in summer. Root used as a coffee substitute.

**Cowslip** - *Primula veris*. 10-15cm. Yellow flowers May/June. Neutral/alkaline soil. Food plant for Duke of Burgundy Fritillary butterfly. Naturalises in meadows or lawns.

**Dames Violet**. *Hesperis matronalis*. 40-90cm. Purple or white flowers May-July, fragrant in the evening. Food plant of the Orange Tip butterfly. Needs good soil, even damp in sun or semi-shade.

**Dark Mullein** - *Verbascum nigrum*. Yellow flowers with purple anthers. 30-60cm. Mullein moth food plant.

**Dropwort**. *Filipendula vulgaris*. Pretty cream/pink flowers June/July. Neutral/alkaline soil. 30-45cm. Well drained soil. Good nectar plant.

**Field Scabious** - *Knautia arvensis*. 30-60cm. Pale blue flowers June-September. Food plant of Marsh Fritillary and Narrow Bordered Bee Hawk Moth. Good nectar plant.

**Great Burnet.** *Sanguisorba officinalis*. 30-60cm. likes damp, neutral to alkaline soil. Wine red raspberry like flower, June/Aug.

**Greater Knapweed.** *Centaurea scabiosa*. 60-100cm. Purple thistle type heads but no prickles! Good nectar plant for late summer, seed heads for birds.

**Heartsease.** *Viola tricolour*. 15-20cm. Pretty wild pansy, purple and yellow. Short lived perennial but self seeds.

**Kidney Vetch.** *Anthyllis vulneraria*. 15-20cm. Pretty wild pansy, purple and yellow flowers, tinged red. Nectar plant, main plant of Small Blue butterfly.

**Lady's Bedstraw.** *Galium verum*. Low growing meadow plant, clusters of tiny yellow flowers. Food plant of several Hawk moths including Humming Bird Hawk Moth.

**Lady's Mantle.** *Alchemilla vulgaris*. 10-20cm. Greenish-yellow flowers May-Sept. Grassy areas or ground cover for damp areas.

**Lesser Knapweed.** *Centaurea nigra*. 40-60cm. Mauve thistle like flowers, July-Sept. Repeat flowering, excellent nectar plant for bees & butterflies, seeds for birds. Meadow plant.

**Maiden Pink.** *Dianthus deltoides*. 10-20cm. Dark rose pink flowers, June-Sept. Well drained soil, neutral to acid.

**Meadow Clary.** *Salvia pratensis*. Up to 80cm. Neutral to alkaline, meadow plant. Purple/blue flowers June-July. Good nectar plant.

**Meadow Cranesbill.** *Geranium pratense*. 30-45cm. Bright blue flowers June onwards. Food plant of Brown Argus butterfly. Good meadow or border plant.

**Musk Mallow.** *Malva moschata*. 30-45cm. Pink or white flowers June -Sept. Good nectar plant. Meadow or border. Food plant of Mallow Skipper butterfly.

**Orange Hawkweed.** *Pilosella aurantiaca*. Commonly known as Fox and Cubs due to the arrangement of the flower heads. Bright orange flowers. 20-30cm. Lovely meadow plant or for areas of very poor soil.

**Ox eye Daisy.** *Leucanthemum vulgare*. 30-45cm. Meadow plant. Also known as Moon Daisy.



**Red Valerian.** *Centranthus ruber*. 45cm. Fragrant red, pink or white flowers all Summer. Butterfly nectar plant. Poor soil.

**Reflexed Stonecrop.** *Sedum rupestre*. 10-20cm, creeping succulent. Bright yellow flowers June-Aug. Good nectar plant for dry, poor soil.

**Rock Cinquefoil.** *Potentilla rupestris*. 30-40cm. Pretty white flowers, rare in the wild. Poor, dry soil.

**Rock Rose.** *Helianthemum nummularium*. Bright yellow flowers May-Sept. Poor soil, neutral/alkaline. Food plant of many moths.

**Rock Sea Spurrey.** *Spergularia rupicola*. Low growing, woody at base, pink/lilac flowers May-Aug. Good for very dry sites.

**Sea Champion.** *Silene maritime*. 10-25cm. White flowers June-Aug. Good for rockeries and dry soils. Food plant of the Marbled Coronet Moth

**Sea Holly.** *Eryngium maritimum*. 60cm. . Spiny, grey-blue flowers June-Aug. Sand, shingle, well drained soil.

**Sea Milkwort.** *Glaux maritime*. Creeping perennial, pink & white flowers May-Sept. Gravel, poor soil.

**Sheepsbit Scabious.** *Jasione Montana*. 10-15cm. Short lived perennial, self seeds. Bright blue flowers June onwards. Good nectar plant.

**Small Scabious.** *Scabiosa columbaria*. 30-45cm. Light blue flowers, July-Sept, produced in profusion. Neutral/alkaline soil. Good nectar plant, seeds for birds.

**Sulphur Cinquefoil.** *Potentilla recta*. 40-60cm. Pale lemon yellow flowers June - Aug. Dry, grassy places or border.

**Thrift.** *Armeria maritime*. 20-30cm. Well drained soil. Pink flowers April-Oct. Moth food plant.

**Thyme, broad leaved.** *Thymus pulegioides*. 10cm, fragrant with purple flowers June-Aug. Food plant of Large Blue butterfly and several moths.

**Thyme, Creeping.** *Thymus praecox*. Low growing, suitable for rockeries, gravel, between paving and walls.

Very attractive to bees.

**Tansy.** *Tanacetum vulgare*. 30-100cm. Yellow button flowers and aromatic leaves. Once used as a flavouring, it is very attractive to bees. Can be invasive.

**Tufted Vetch.** *Vicia cracca*. Climbing perennial for banks and hedgerows. Blue violet flowers June-Aug. 2-3ft. Also grows in semi shade.

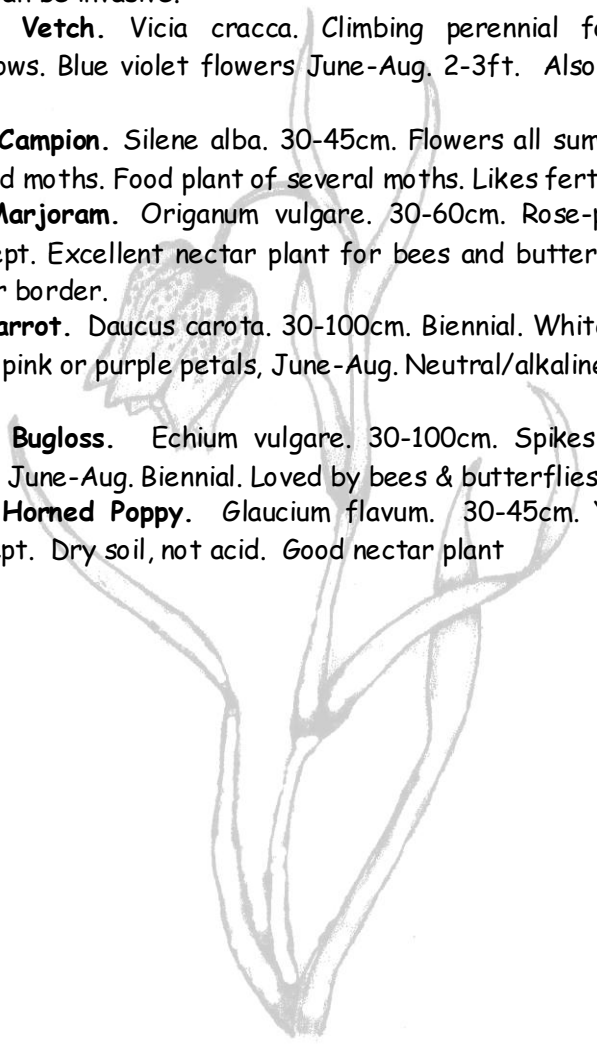
**White Campion.** *Silene alba*. 30-45cm. Flowers all summer. Loved by bees and moths. Food plant of several moths. Likes fertile soil.

**Wild Marjoram.** *Origanum vulgare*. 30-60cm. Rose-purple flowers July-Sept. Excellent nectar plant for bees and butterflies. Grow in grass or border.

**Wild Carrot.** *Daucus carota*. 30-100cm. Biennial. White flowers with central pink or purple petals, June-Aug. Neutral/alkaline soil. Meadow plant.

**Viper's Bugloss.** *Echium vulgare*. 30-100cm. Spikes of vivid blue flowers June-Aug. Biennial. Loved by bees & butterflies.

**Yellow Horned Poppy.** *Glaucium flavum*. 30-45cm. Yellow flowers May-Sept. Dry soil, not acid. Good nectar plant



## Trees.

**Rowan.** *Sorbus aucuparia*. Max height 15 metres. White flowers in spring. Berries (loved by birds) and good autumn colour. Neutral to acid soil. Sunny position, very wind tolerant.

**Silver Birch.** *Betula pendula*. Max ht 30 metres. A graceful tree, fast growing, characterised by peeling white bark. Neutral to acid soil. Found in woods or open ground.

**Beech.** *Fagus sylvatica*. Max ht 30-40 metres. Brilliant green leaves in spring and lovely autumn colour. Prefers neutral or alkaline soil. Ideal hedging plant as it keeps leaves in winter when trimmed. Creates dense shade in summer.

**Small Leaved Lime.** *Tilia cordata*. Max ht 30m. Fragrant flowers were used for honey and tea! Often grows with Ash.

**Whitebeam.** *Sorbus aria*. Max ht 20m. Leaves appear white underneath. Pretty white flowers in spring followed by berries, loved by birds. Neutral to alkaline soil. Tolerates wind.

**Ash.** *Fraxinus excelsior*. Max ht 30-40m. A woodland tree with a light canopy. Neutral to alkaline soil, preferably damp. Useful timber for furniture and for burning.

**Bird Cherry.** *Prunus padus*. Max ht 15m. Lovely white blossom in spring, black fruits are eaten by birds. Tolerates most soils, a woodland or hedgerow tree.

**Wild Cherry.** *Prunus avium*. Max ht 60ft. Lovely blossom and red fruits for birds. Needs space and sun, plant several together for good fruit. Not fussy about soil type.

**Aspen.** *Populus tremula*. Max ht 65ft. Grows well in the west on well drained but damp soils. Need plenty of sun. Trembling silver-grey leaves in summer and a rich golden yellow in autumn.

**Hornbeam.** *Carpinus betulus*. Max ht 30m. Prefers moist clay soil. Brilliant yellow autumn colour. Also good for hedging as it retains some leaves.

**Wild Service Tree.** *Sorbus torminalis*. Max ht 25m. Grows on clay, neutral to alkaline soil. White blossom in spring, fruits and good leaf colour in Autumn.

**Oak.** *Quercus robur*. Max ht 40m. Common tree of woods and hedges, especially on clay. Used for building, ship building and furniture. Important tree for wildlife.

**Red barked dogwood.** *Cornus alba*. Similar to above but produces red stems if coppiced.

**Elder.** *Sambucus nigra*. Ht 10-30ft. Likes nitrogen rich soil. White flowers (makes good cordial) and black berries. Shrub or small tree.

**Field Maple.** *Acer campestre*. Ht 20-40ft. Spring leaves have a red tinge, lovely yellow autumn colour. Good hedge plant.

**Wayfaring Tree.** *Viburnum lantana*. Ht 10-16ft. Neutral to alkaline soil. White flowers in spring, red and black berries, loved by birds.

**Wild Privet.** *Ligustrum vulgare*. Ht 6-10ft. Lovely white blossom in July, followed by black berries for birds. Main food plant of the Privet Hawk Moth (caterpillar is light green with lilac stripes). Deciduous, unlike the common privet which is semi evergreen.

**Gorse.** *Ulex europaeus*. Bright yellow flowers January to July. Very spiny, forms thickets which are good for nesting birds. Ht 6-10ft.

**Guelder Rose.** *Viburnum opulus*. Ht 10-13ft. Likes moist soil and full sun. Lovely white flowers in spring, red berries and leaves in autumn.

**Cherry Plum.** *Prunus cerasifera*. Also known as Myrobalan. Ht to 10ft. Flowers earlier than blackthorn and produces a green fruit.

**Spindle.** *Euonymus europaeus*. Ht to 30ft. Likes moist but well drained soil. Brilliant autumn colour. red berries split to show orange seeds.

**Dog Rose.** *Rosa canina*. Ht to 9ft. Ideal for growing through a tree or hedge. White or pink flowers, red hips. Sun or semi shade.

**Burnet Rose.** *Rosa pimpinellifolia*. Low growing (2-3ft), thicket forming. Ideal in seaside gardens as a windbreak, or in well drained soil. Fragrant creamy white flowers early spring. Black hips.

**Sweet Briar.** *Rosa rubiginosa*. (Eglantine rose). Ht to 10ft. Good as a hedge on its own or in a mixed hedge, or as a free-standing shrub. Deep pink flowers, apple scented foliage. Sun or semi shade.

## Plants for Semi-shade

**Betony.** *Stachys officinalis*. 30cm. Deep magenta flowers June-Sept. Groundcover for hedgebanks, or meadow plant. Will grow in sun or shade. Attractive to bees.

**Bugle.** *Ajuga reptans*. 10-15cm. Good groundcover for semi shade or shade. Moist soil. Purple spikes of flowers May-July.

**Columbine.** *Aquilegia vulgaris*. 30-60cm. Intense blue flowers May-July. Sun or shade, preferably fertile, neutral/alkaline soil.

**Cow Parsley.** *Anthriscus sylvestris*. To 1.5m. Lacy white flowers from May -June. Hedgerows, woodland edge. Nectar plant for hoverflies and honeybees.

**Fragrant Agrimony.** *Agrimonia procera*. 60-100cm. Lemon scented leaves, yellow flowers June-Aug. Well drained soil.

**Hedge Bedstraw.** *Galium mollugo*. A trailing plant with heads of small white flowers. Hedgerow or banks. Food plant of several moths including the Elephant and Humming-Bird Hawk Moths.

**Hedge Garlic.** *Alliaria petiolata*. 20-80cm. Biennial. Small white flowers April-June. Food plant of Green veined White and Orange Tip butterflies.

**Nottingham Catchfly.** *Silene nutans*. 30cm. Greenish white flowers open late afternoon, fragrant and nectar-rich for butterflies and moths.

**Round-headed Rampion.** *Phyteuma orbiculare*. Attractive large heads of blue-violet flowers June-Aug. Neutral/alkaline soil.

**Welsh Poppy.** *Meconopsis cambrica*. 20-30cm. Bright yellow poppy flowers June-Aug. Well drained soil, semi-shade or shade.

**Wild Strawberry.** *Fragaria vesca*. 10-15cm. White flowers Apr-July, followed by edible, small sweet strawberries. Good groundcover for dry shade. Food plant for several moths.

## Plants for Shade

**Bluebell.** *Hyacinthoides non-scripta*. 45-60cm. Woodland bulb but will also grow in sun on well drained neutral/acid soil. Fragrant flowers.

**Creeping Jenny.** *Lysimachia nummularia*. 10cm with creeping stems. Bright yellow cup flowers May-Aug. For woodland, or damp soil/meadows in sun.

**Dog Violet.** *Viola riviniana*. 10-15cm. Purple flowers Apr-June. Food plant of several Fritillary butterflies.

**Early Dog Violet.** *Viola reichenbachiana*. 20cm. Blue/purple flowers with darker spur, March-May.

Food plant of several Fritillary butterflies.

**Foxglove.** *Digitalis purpurea*. 100-200cm. Purple/red flowers June-August. Prefers well-drained, neutral/acid soil. Will also grow in sun. Good for bees, food plant for several moths.

**Giant Bellflower.** *Campanula latifolia*. 1m. Blue (or white) flowers, July-Aug. Moist soils. Loved by bees.

**Greater Stitchwort.** *Stellaria holostea*. For damp, shady banks. White flowers, April-June.

**Ground Ivy.** *Glechoma hederacea*. Groundcover for shade, evergreen, small purple flowers March-May. Also

Grows in sun and semi-shade Food plant of Checkered Skipper butterfly.

**Martagon Lily.** *Lilium martagon*. (Turk's Cap Lily.) 1m. Well drained, neutral to alkaline soil. Purple flowers May-July. Also grows in sun.

**Nettle-leaved Bellflower.** *Campanula trachelium*. 30-45cm. Dark blue flowers July-Sept. Shade or semi shade.

**Oxlip.** *Primula elatior*. 15-20cm. Pale yellow flowers April/May. Best in damp shade.

**Primrose.** *Primula vulgaris*. 8-15cm. Yellow flowers February or March-June. Pollinated by night-flying moths. Food plant for several species of moth. Damp soil, shade or semi shade.

**White Deadnettle.** *Lamium album*. 15-40cm. Pretty white flowers throughout the year. Food plant for several moths. Loved by bumblebees. Sun or semi-shade.

**Yellow Archangel.** *Lamiastrum galiobdolon*. Yellow flowers with red streaks, May-June. Good ground cover.

## Bare-Root Native Trees & Shrubs

These are available from November to March, although we always have a selection available in containers all year round.

Hedging plants are usually planted in a double row with 1ft/30cm between the rows and the plants staggered 45cm/18" apart in the rows. This requires 5 or 6 plants per metre of hedge.

### Hedging, shrubs and small trees.

**Hawthorn.** *Crataegus monogyna*. Max ht 10-14m. Masses of spring blossom, berries in autumn for birds. Used mainly for hedging but makes a lovely small tree. Any soil.

**Blackthorn.** *Prunus spinosa*. Max ht 3-4m. One of the earliest flowering native shrubs. Produces sloes. Good shrub for nesting birds. Any soil.

**Alder Buckthorn** *Rhamnus frangula*. Max ht 6m. Small flowers, berries for birds. Important as a food plant for the Brimstone butterfly, and the Green Hairstreak. Prefers damp, acid soils.

**Hazel** *Corylus avellana*. Max ht 6m. Catkins early spring, nuts from August. Makes a small tree, or can be coppiced, or trimmed as a hedge. Food plant for lots of moths.

**Crab Apple.** *Malus sylvestris*. Max ht 8-10m. White blossom, birds feed on ripe fruit. The true native has thorns.

**Broom.** *Cytisus scoparius*. Max ht 13ft. Brilliant yellow flowers late spring. Becomes woody with age and is best replaced by younger plants. Food plant of butterflies and moths.

**Sea Buckthorn.** *Hippophae rhamnoides*. Good windbreak hedge for coastal conditions. Silver-grey leaves, orange fruit. Very spiny.

**Common Dogwood.** *Cornus sanguinea*. Ht 6-13ft. Colourful shrub with white flowers, black fruit and good autumn colour. Full sun, not very drought tolerant.

**Wood Anemone.** *Anemone nemorosa*. Also known as 'Windflower' because it can be found growing on hilltops, particularly in the north in March/April. In the south it is found in deciduous woods. Grow in sun or shade in poorish soil without grass. White star flowers, tinged with pink, attractive foliage lasts all summer.

**Winter Aconite.** *Eranthis hyemalis*. A native of Europe but naturalises well in Britain. Large yellow flowers January-March. Grow in shade or sun, lovely with snowdrops. Supplied freshly lifted and not allowed to dry out.

## WATER PLANTS

**Arrowhead.** *Sagittaria sagittifolia*. 45-60cm. Spikes of white, single flowers rise above the foliage. Depth to 18".

**Bogbean.** *Menyanthes trifoliata*. 20-30cm. Pretty fringed white flowers in spring, good for pond edge up to 6" depth.

**Brooklime.** *Veronica beccabunga*. 20-60cm. Bright blue small flowers May-Sept.

**Cuckoo Flower.** *Cardamine pratensis*. 15-30cm. Pink flowers in spring. Native to damp meadows. Food plant of the Orange Tip and Green Veined White butterflies.

**Devils Bit Scabious.** *Succisa pratensis*. 45cm, lavender blue flowers late summer. Rich in nectar. Food plant of Marsh Fritillary butterfly and Narrow Bordered Bee Hawkmoth.

**Flowering Rush** *Butomus umbellatus*. 60-90cm. Showy pink flowers mid-late summer. Depth up to 9".

**Greater Spearwort.** *Ranunculus lingua*. 60-120cm. Large yellow flowers May onwards. Spreads readily.

**Hemp Agrimony.** *Eupatorium cannabinum*. 45-60cm. Pink flowers July-Sept. Butterfly nectar plant and food plant for several moths.

**Hop Sedge.** *Carex pseudocyperus*. Prefers wet soil, sun or semi shade.

**Marsh Cinquefoil.** *Potentilla palustris*. 20-40cm. Pink flowers June-July. Prefers an acidic soil.

**Marsh Marigold.** *Caltha palustris*. 30-60cm. Lovely yellow flowers in spring. Full sun, depth up to 12".

**Marsh Woundwort.** *Stachys palustris*. 30-60cm. Red, spotted flowers June-autumn. Good bee plant.

**Meadowsweet.** *Filipendula ulmaria*. 60-100cm. Fragrant cream flowers late summer. Hoverfly/bee nectar plant. Food plant of several moths including the Emporer moth.

**Purple Loosestrife.** *Lythrum salicaria*. 45-60cm, rose-magenta spires of flowers June-Aug. Food plant of several moths.

**Ragged Robin.** *Lychnis flos-cuculi*. Moist soil, sun or dappled shade. Bright pink ragged flowers May-July. Food plant of Campion & Lychnis moths

**Water Avens.** *Geum rivale*. 20-30cm. Peach-red flowers May. Groundcover for a wet shady place.

**Water forgetmenot.** *Myosotis scorpioides*. 20-30cm. Blue flowers from early May. Moist shade, semi-shade.

**Water Mint.** *Mentha aquatica*. 30-40cm, pink flowers June onwards. Food plant of Water Ermine moth.

**Yellow Flag Iris.** *Iris pseodacorus*. 40-200cm. Yellow flowers from June. Likes roots in water and full sun. Food plant of several moths.

**Wild Daffodil**. *Narcissus pseudonarcissus*. Made famous by the Wordsworth poem and known as the 'Lent Lily'. Height 8-12" with pale petals and deep yellow centre. Naturalises in Damp woods and grassland. Flowers March.

**Snakes Head Fritillary**. *Fritillaria meleagris*. Red/purple chequered flowers, occasionally white. A beautiful sight en masse in wet meadows in April-May. Height 8-16". Plant in damp grassland or a loamy soil, in a sunny site.

**Wild Garlic (Ramson)**. *Allium ursinum*. Grows in damp woods and hedgerows, spreading profusely. An attractive sight in April/May with white flowers, 9" high. The bulb is edible and the leaves are delicious in salads and soups.
